I forever release the Solano County Fair, the California Authority of Racing Fairs and any of their affiliated organizations from any and all action, claims, or demands that I, my assignees, heirs, distributees, guardians, next of kin, spouse and legal representatives now have or may hereafter have for injury or damage resulting from my participation in the Solano County Fair Dog Races.

SOLANO COUNTY FAIR DOG RACES PROCEDURES

Entries consist of: 1) Official Entry Form 2) Release and Waiver of Liability Agreement and 3) Photograph of your dog. Entries will be accepted on a first-come/first-served basis. The winner of each heat will win \$30 and the second place winner will receive \$20. The winner of the Championship heat will win \$50, the second place winner in the Championship Heat will win \$25.

DOG REQUIREMENTS

The Solano County Fair Dog Races are open to all breeds and mixed breeds of small dogs. The only requirement for a dog to race in the Solano County Fair Dog Races is that the dog **WEIGH 30 LBS. OR LESS (within reason)**. If a dog looks like it may weigh more than 30lbs at the time of entry, the dog may be weighed in the presence of its owner on calibrated scale and disqualified at the discretion of racing officials.

Every effort will be made to place dogs of similar breeds and/or weights into the same heat. The Championship heats will be a mixture of the winners from the preliminary heats (see more below).

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES. A dog may be disqualified at any time for showing any degree of aggression.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES

Each dog will run in one preliminary heat. The winner of each heat will compete in the final race. The top two finishers in the final race will qualify for the Solano County Fair Dog Races Finals.

A maximum of 108 dogs will compete in the preliminary heats.

There will be a MAXIMUM of 9 preliminary heats. If there are fewer than 108 entries, the number of heats will be adjusted accordingly.

The number of dogs in each heat will depend on the number of entries, with a MAXIMUM of twelve dogs per heat.

If entries exceed 108 dogs, owners will be limited to two dogs per human competitor.

If more than 108 entries are received for the races, contestants will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis. If fewer than 108 entries are received, every attempt will be made to place an equal number of dogs in each heat.

Two handlers are required per dog: one handler remains with the dog behind the starting gate, the other handler will stand behind the finish line to call the dog and collect him/her after the race. At least one handler must be 18 years of age or older. When on the racetrack, dogs must remain in the arms of one owner until placed in the starting gate.

For the safety of the dogs, **handlers are not permitted to leave their designated places while the dogs are competing.**

Starting gate positions will be determined prior to the start of the racing events.

Dogs will be a neck ribbon that corresponds to the gate position they will be starting from. Once given a neck ribbon each dog will receive a color coordinated racing jacket that must be worn during their race. If the jacket does not fit the dog, the dog must wear the neck ribbon tied to its collar. Each dog must start out of their assigned post position. A racing official will call all dogs to line up for their respective heats.

An announcement will be given by a track official for handlers to place their dogs in the starting gate. At this time, the finish line handlers will be asked to go to the area behind the finish line to call their dogs. Finish line handlers should position themselves in starting gate order so that dogs will not be encouraged to cross paths with one another.

Once the dogs are settled in the gate, the track announcer will state “Ready, Set, Go” and the starter will open the gate. Please allow your dog to run freely out of the gate of his/her own accord. Because the back of the starting gate is open, handlers may pet/hold their dogs while they are inside. In order to encourage your dog to leave the gate, handlers may want to step back from the gate just before the start.

Once the starting gate has been opened, finish-line handlers are to call their dogs across the finish line and into the receiving area. You may use snacks, squeaky toys, etc. to coax your dogs. Loud noisemakers, live animals other than dachshunds, and anything deemed to be disruptive to other dogs will not be permitted. **In order to be declared the winner, all 4 paws must cross the finish line.**

Once the first dog (with all four paws) has crossed the finish line, the handlers of the other dogs are requested to continue to call their dogs until all dogs are with their respective owners. If your dog does not come to you within a reasonable amount of time after the finish of the race (determined by the finish-line Wiener Nationals Official), you will be allowed to enter the course and collect your dog. **Please be careful, and do not interfere with anyone else’s dog.**

The Championship Heat will consist of the 1st place winners of all the previous heats. The procedures for the final heat will be the same as above.

Racing Officials will determine the winners (video will be used in close finishes). Decisions of the Racing Officials are final.

The winner of the Championship and his/her owner and handlers will come to the winner’s circle on the racetrack for photos and a short interview following the race. Additionally, there will be an opportunity for your dog to “sign” autographs for the fans after the races.

Racing Officials will determine 1st place winners. In the event of a tie, the dogs involved will have a “run-off” to determine the winner. Every attempt will be made to schedule “run-offs” at least one heat later, to allow the dogs a chance to rest.

Decisions of the Racing Officials are final.

The winner of the Solano County Fair Dog Races and his/her owner and handlers will come to the winner’s circle on the racetrack for photos.

Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to this event, without claim for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions and definitions not covered explicitly in these rules will be decided by the management of the Solano County Fair with those decisions to be final.
